People For People may be able to offer personalized, confidential assistance if you are:

- Between the ages of 18-72, legally entitled to work in the U.S., and have an income 200% and above the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) AND are below self-sufficiency.

 - Change or increase in family size

 - You lack education or certain occupational skills
 - You were previously incarcerated or are justice-involved
 - You have reached the end of unemployment benefits or other public assistance
 - You are a recent victim of domestic violence or stalking
