



HAS YOUR LAWYER'S OR IMMIGRATION REPRESENTATIVE'S OFFICE CLOSED? DID YOU SUDDENLY LOSE YOUR LAWYER, OR CAN YOU NO LONGER CONTACT THEM?

If you no longer have legal representation, it is important to act quickly to protect your immigration case. Immigration deadlines can be very strict, and missing an appointment, interview, or hearing can have serious consequences.

1. CHECK THE STATUS OF YOUR CASE

USCIS

- Check your case at egov.uscis.gov
- You will need your receipt number

IMMIGRATION COURT

- Check your case at acis.eoir.justice.gov
- Or call 1-800-898-7180
- You will need your A-Number

Check if you have any pending hearings, interviews, biometric appointments, requests for evidence, or decisions.

2. UPDATE YOUR ADDRESS

USCIS

- Form AR-11

IMMIGRATION COURT

- Form EOIR-33

Important: Changing your address with USCIS does not automatically update your address with the Immigration Court. You may need to notify both agencies.

3. REQUEST A COPY OF YOUR FILE

Request copies of:

- Filed forms and applications
- Submitted evidence
- USCIS receipts
- Correspondence related to your case
- Immigration notices
- Documents signed by you

4. KEEP ALL YOUR DOCUMENTATION

Keep:

- Representation contracts or agreements
- Receipts and proofs of payment
- Text messages
- Letters
- Immigration notices
- Bills
- Emails

5. SEEK A SECOND LEGAL OPINION.

Consult an immigration attorney or an organization recognized by the Department of Justice if:

- You do not know what was filed in your case
- You never received copies of your documents
- You believe there were errors or a lack of communication
- You missed an appointment or hearing
- You have questions about the status of your case

6. AVOID IMMIGRATION FRAUD

Be wary of anyone who:

- Guarantees results
- Asks you to sign blank forms
- Refuses to give you copies of your documents
- Suggests you provide false information
- Does not provide written contracts or receipts

Always ask if the person is:

- A licensed attorney, or
- A representative accredited by the Department of Justice (DOJ)

7. IF YOU BELIEVE THERE WAS MISCONDUCT

You may file a complaint with:

- Washington State Attorney General's Office (atg.wa.gov)
- Washington State Bar Association (wsba.org)
- Executive Office for Immigration Review (justice.gov/eoir)

REMEMBER

- ✓ You have the right to obtain copies of your documents.
 - ✓ You have the right to know what was filed on your behalf.
 - ✓ You have the right to seek a second legal opinion.
 - ✓ Keep copies of all documents related to your case.
 - ✓ Never sign blank forms.
 - ✓ Immigration deadlines can be very strict. Do not wait to take action.
- Early, reliable information can make a significant difference in your immigration case.

HOW TO CHANGE YOUR ADDRESS WITH USCIS

1

Complete Form AR-11 (Change of Address).

Write your new address clearly.
Include your A-Number, if you have one.
Sign and date the form.

2

Make a copy of the AR-11 for your records.
If you have USCIS receipts (Form I-797), make copies of them as well.
If you have multiple pending cases, include a letter listing all your receipt numbers.

3

Place the signed AR-11 and any additional letter in an envelope.

Important: If you have a pending or approved VAWA, T-visa, or U-visa application, or a Form I-485 based on any of these benefits, do not submit your change of address online. Instead, call the USCIS Contact Center at 800-375-5283 or send a signed Form AR-11 (or a signed letter notifying of the change of address) to the center processing your case:

IMPORTANT:

If you do not update your address with the Immigration Court, you could miss hearing notices and other important correspondence.

REMEMBER:

If you have a case with USCIS and also a case in Immigration Court, you generally must update your address with both agencies.

The immigration court will send you a copy of the form. The immigration court will only make any change(s) to your contact information in EOIR-33 if you provide the correct information. Your contact information based on different information on pleadings, motions, or other court documents will not be used.

If you fail to appear at any hearing before an immigration judge when notice of that hearing was sent to you, you may be subject to removal or deportation. If you fail to appear at any hearing before an immigration judge when notice of that hearing was sent to you, DHS may take you into custody. In addition, the immigration court may consider your failure to appear as evidence of your lack of credibility or exclusion against you. If the court enters such an order, you may be ineligible for certain immigration benefits.

- If you are in *removal* proceedings: You will be subject to an order of removal for a period of five years after the date of the entry of the final order. You may also become ineligible for voluntary departure, cancellation of removal, and adjustment of status or change of status.
- If you are in *deportation* proceedings: You will be subject to an order of deportation for a period of five years after the date of the entry of the final order. You may also become ineligible for voluntary departure, suspension of deportation or voluntary departure, and adjustment of status or change of status.
- If you are in *exclusion* proceedings: Your application for admission to the United States may be considered withdrawn.

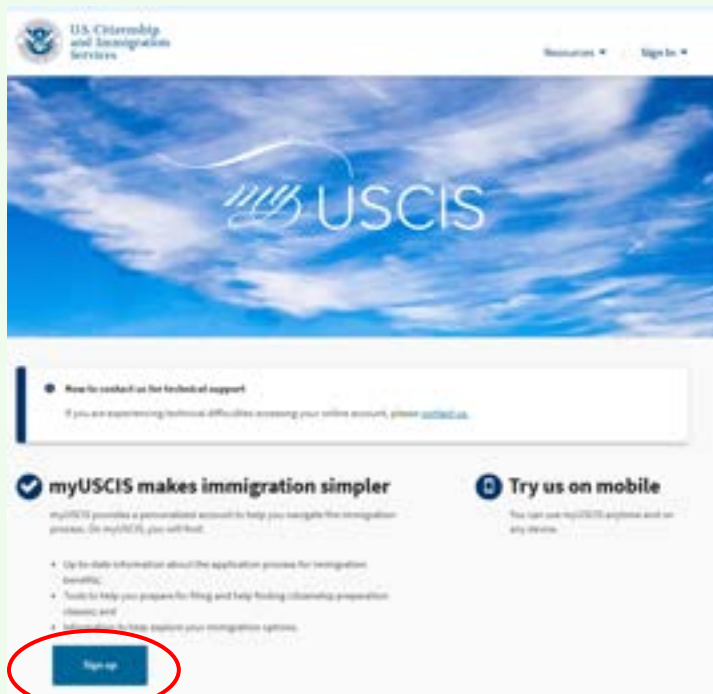

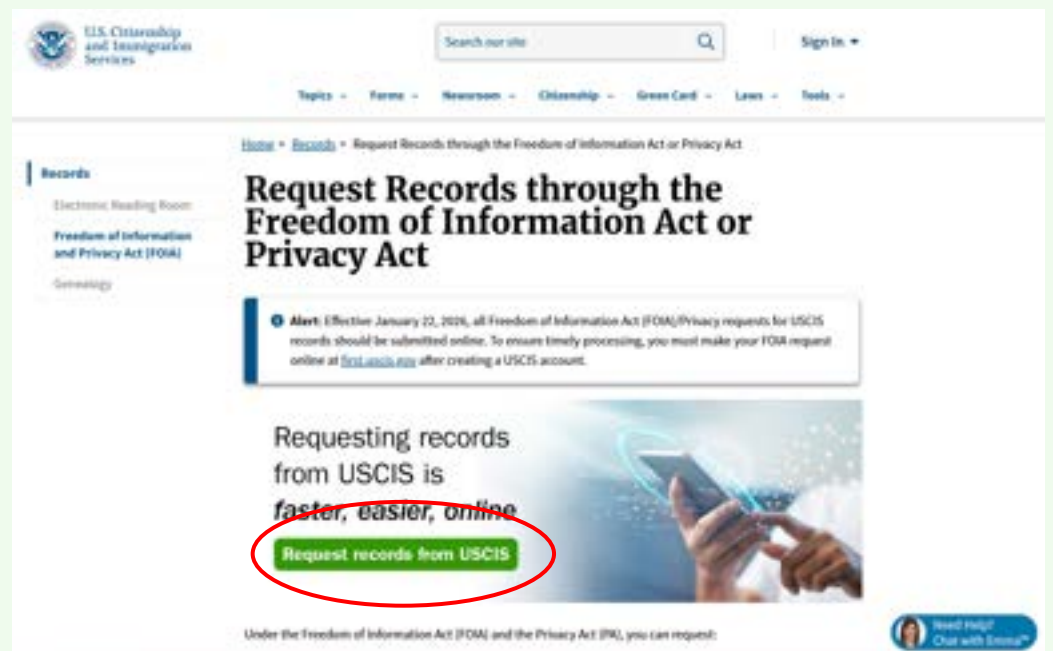

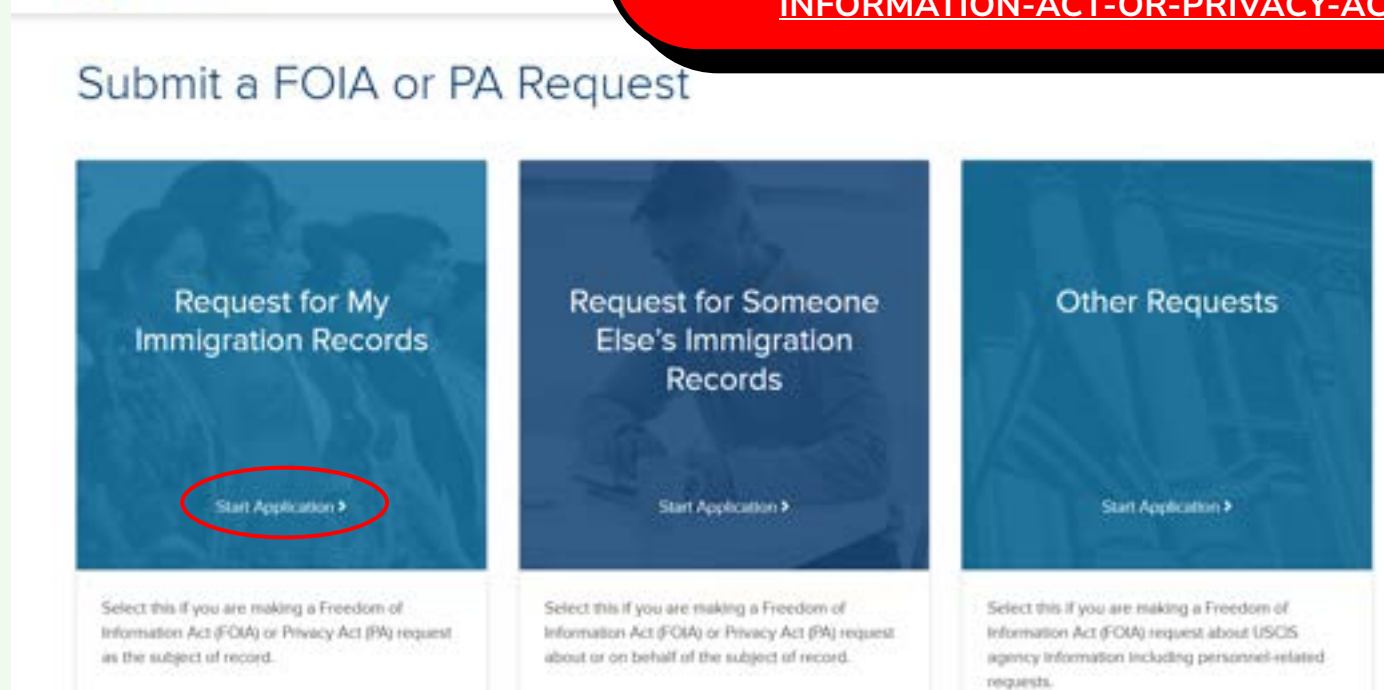

- Proof they are deceased, with a death certificate, obituary, photograph of a funeral memorial or monument, or screen print from the Social Security Death Index; or probate documents filed in court. This is not required if they were born more than 100 years before you submit this form.
